

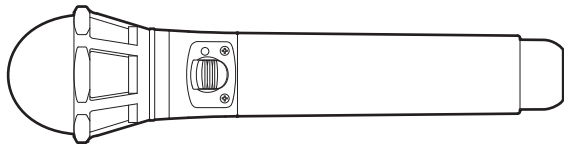

Thank you for purchasing this Audio-Technica product. Before using the product, please read through the Quick Start Guide, as well as this user manual when necessary, to ensure that you can use the product correctly.



- Light, compact short-type microphone
- High sound quality, dynamic microphone unit
- Power-saving design that has 3 levels of infrared output (ECO/LO/HI) for different room sizes
- With up to 8 hours of continuous use (in ECO mode) optimal for karaoke service
- Channels available for up to 8 microphones in the same room
- Microphone unit assembly and grip low-assembly can be quickly exchanged

* This product must be used in combination with an Audio-Technica infrared wireless receiver and battery charger that are sold separately. Visit our web site for information on compatible models.

Important information

Warning:

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not expose this apparatus to rain or moisture.

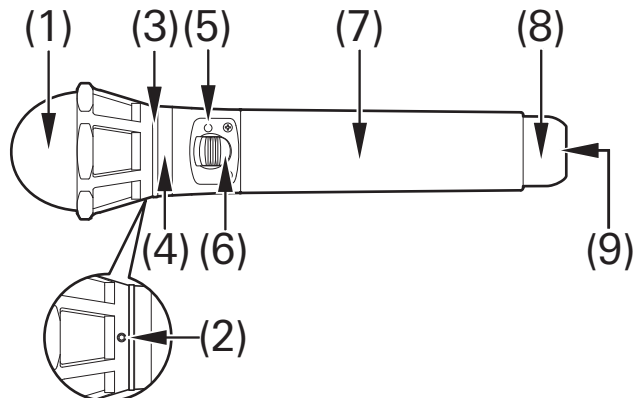
This equipment has been tested and found to comply with the limits for a Class B digital device, pursuant to part 15 of the FCC Rules. Notes on use

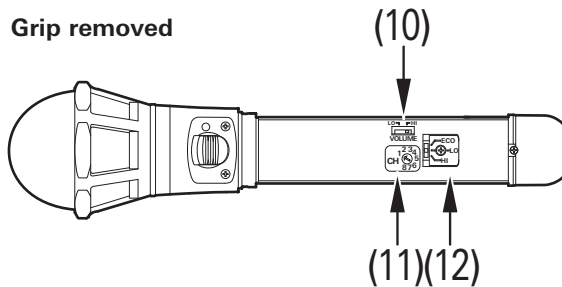
- Be sure to also read the connecting device's user manual before use.
- Do not cover the infrared emitter with your hand.
- Do not grip or twist the infrared emitter. Doing so may result in a malfunction.
- The distance the infrared light can reach varies by the color and material of the walls, ceiling, and/or floor.
- Noise may occur irrespective of the distance. In such a case, reattach the receiver unit in a different place.
- Battery level is not correctly indicated when commercial-grade AA alkaline dry cells are used.
- The rechargeable battery is not supplied charged.
- When charged for the first time or after not having been used for a long time, the rechargeable battery may not last as long. In such a case, repeat the charge-discharge cycle several times to improve charging performance.
- To protect the rechargeable battery, charge it at least once every 6 months when keeping it in storage for an extended period of time. If too much time passes between charges, the rechargeable battery may not last as long or may no longer be able to be charged.
- Repeated charging without using up the charge in the rechargeable battery causes a memory effect where battery drain occurs irrespective of the charged state. Start charging only after using up the charge, which is when the indicator lamp turns off. If the problem still persists, the rechargeable battery may have reached the end of its life. In such a case, replace it with a new rechargeable battery.
- Repeated charging of the rechargeable battery causes the maximum capacity of the battery to drop. When the effective battery time starts getting shorter, a battery replacement is recommended.
- The rechargeable battery may have white powder-like adhesion. This does not indicate a malfunction. Wipe it off completely using dry cloth and use the rechargeable battery again.

Part names and functions



Back side

Grip removed



(1) Head case

(2) Head case screw

(3) Design ring

(4) Ring nameplate

(5) Power indicator lamp

Displays the battery level when the microphone is turned on.

White light ON : Ready for use

White blinking / No light: Charge the device.

* The indicated charge level is for reference only.

* When the power indicator lamp is blinking white, the reception range may be reduced, which can result in noise or interruption.

(6) Power switch

Slide the switch upward to turn on the power.

(7) Grip

(8) Infrared emitter

(9) Charging terminal

(10) Volume control switch

Use this switch to change the volume setting.

(11) Channel (ch) switch

Use this switch to change the channel (carrier frequency).

(12) Output control switch

Use this switch to change the infrared output setting.

Inserting the battery/batteries

In case of an emergency, this product can be used with two commercial-grade AA alkaline dry cells. Battery level is not correctly indicated in this case.

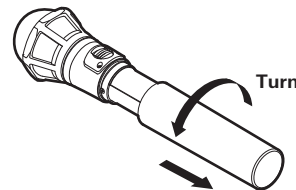
Never charge alkaline batteries.

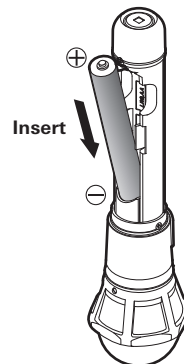
Turn the grip counter-clockwise to remove it.



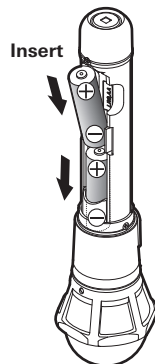
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Turn the head case downward and insert the battery/batteries from the ⊖ side.

When using the dedicated nickel-metal hydride battery

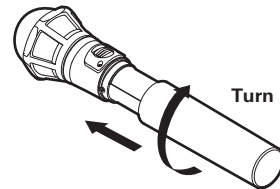


* When using AA alkaline dry cells
* Insert one at a time.



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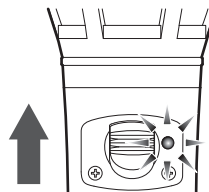
Slip the grip over the microphone and turn it clockwise until it comes to a stop.



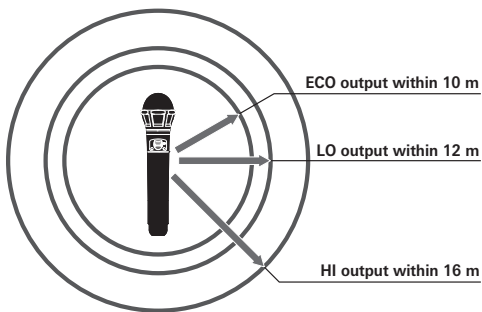
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Turn on the power switch, and if the power indicator lamp turns on, the microphone is functioning correctly.

* A blinking white or non-lit power indicator lamp indicates battery drain.



Transmission range



* When the receiver's mute (reception sensitivity) switch, etc. is turned on (to the "入" position), the transmission range is as follows:
HI: 9 m / LO: 7 m / ECO: 5 m

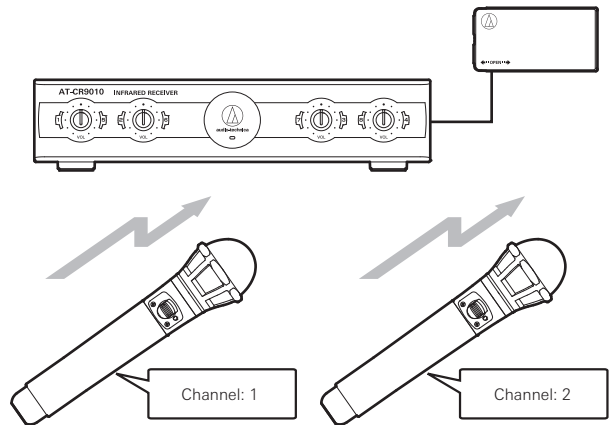
- * The above transmission range is an approximate range under conditions where there is open space and no obstruction between this product and the receiver unit.
- * The transmission range can vary depending on the ambient environment and receiver settings.
- * Any obstruction between the product and the receiver unit may cause noise or sound disruption even within the above transmission range.

Wireless system

When using more than one of this product at the same time, set each unit to a different channel.

- * Two wireless systems set to the same channel cannot be used at the same time.
- * Maintain a distance of at least 1.5 m between this product and the receiver unit during use.
Otherwise malfunction and/or noise may occur.
- * Use this product away from any nearby TVs or other digital equipment.
Otherwise transmission may be affected by radio waves and/or noise.

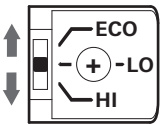
Using the product

Read the user manual for Audio-Technica infrared wireless receiver sold separately.

- (1) Charge this product.
- (2) Check the receiver's output switch setting (Microphone - Line).
- (3) Turn on the power to the receiver.
* You will not hear any sound for about 3 seconds after turning on the power.
- (4) Turn on the power to this product.
- (5) After checking that sound is produced, adjust the volume using your device or receiver.

Switching the output setting

To adjust the transmission range, slide the output control switch to change the setting.



- * ECO: Low output, LO: Standard, HI: High output
- * The continuous use time changes along with any change to the output setting.
- * Set to "LO" by factory default.

Switching the channel

Turn off the power, and turn the channel switch to change the channel.

- * Changing the channel while the power is turned on will cause noise.



The frequencies corresponding to the channels for this product are shown in the chart below.

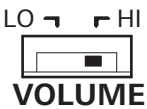
1 ch	2.06 MHz	5 ch	2.34 MHz
2 ch	2.56 MHz	6 ch	2.84 MHz
3 ch	3.20 MHz	7 ch	2.98 MHz
4 ch	3.70 MHz	8 ch	3.48 MHz

- * Set to "1 ch" by factory default.

Changing the volume setting

When using an Audio-Technica microphone other than this product together with this product at the same time, change the volume setting to adjust the volume.

Slide the volume control switch to change the setting.

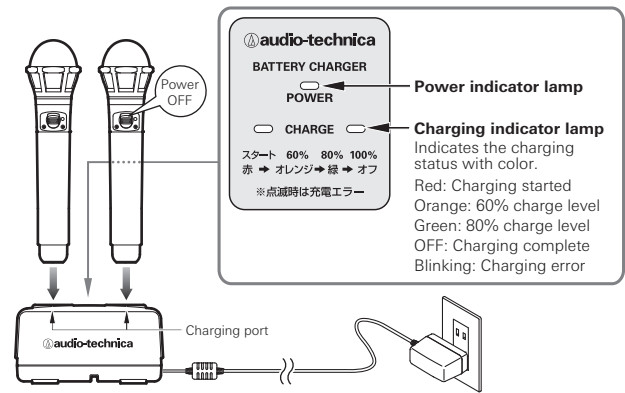


- * LO: Low volume, HI: High volume
- * Set to "HI" by factory default.

Charging the battery

Read the user manual for Audio-Technica battery charger sold separately.

■ Example of use



- (1) Turn off the power and connect this product to the charging port.

- * Connect this product to the charger and if the charging indicator lamp blinks, there may be an error. Try again after turning the charger off and on.
- * When the product is connected to the charging port while it is powered on, the product turns off automatically and charging starts. (Auto OFF function)

- (2) While a device is being charged, the charging indicator lamp changes according to the charging status.
(Red → Orange → Green)
- (3) Charging is complete when the charging indicator lamp turns off.

- * Charging will complete in **about 5.5 hours**.
- * The rechargeable battery in this product lasts about 1 year with proper use or for about 750 charging cycles.
- * The indicated charge level is for reference only. Use this product after it is fully charged (charging indicator lamp turns off) whenever possible.
- * If only a small amount of charge had been drained from the rechargeable battery, the charging quickly completes automatically.

Troubleshooting

Use the following tips as a reference.

If the problem persists, please contact your local Audio-Technica dealer.

Q. The product does not turn on.
A: Check that the product is charged.
Q. Receiver is not responding.
A1: Check for any obstruction between this product and the receiver unit.
A2: Check the distance between this product and the receiver unit to make sure that they are not too far apart.
Q. Battery drains quickly after full charge.
A: Battery may have developed a memory effect. Turn on the power switch and after leaving this product for more than 5 hours, turn off the power switch and try charging again.
* If the problem still persists after performing the above operation, the rechargeable battery may have reached the end of its life (750 times of charging). In such a case, replace it with a new rechargeable battery.
